In the 6th Century, an Irish monk St. Columba founded the Celtic Abbey of the Isle of Iona, considered to be the birthplace of Christianity in Scotland. Today, the Iona Community is an ecumenical Christian community that is committed to seeking new ways of living the Gospel in today's world. Founded in 1938 it remains committed to rebuilding the common life through working for social and political change, serving for the renewal of the church with an ecumenical emphasis, and exploring new, more inclusive approaches to worship. The Community now has over 240 members and about 1500 Associate Members and 1500 Friends.

Third Candle

Leader: Dwell with us this night, O God.

All: Dwell with us in love.

(Handheld candles are then distributed.)

Invocation

Leader: Encircle me, O God, Encircle me with your presence.

All: Repeat the Invocation together A Collect for Christmas Night

A Reading from the Hebrew Scriptures Isaiah 9: 2-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire.
