





Four named to election slate for 28th Presiding Bishop

Electing and confirming a new presiding bishop to serve a nine-year term will be a top order of business for the 81st General Convention when it convenes June 23-28 in Louisville, Kentucky. Five candidates are scheduled to address bishops and deputies in a two-hour session on June 21. The nominating committee will formally submit their names June 25 during a joint session of the House of Bishops and House of Deputies, and on June 26, the House of Bishops will hold a closed session at Christ Church Cathedral for the election. The bishops then will ask the House of Deputies to vote to confirm the result of the election. Bishops J. Scott Barker (Nebraska), Daniel Gutiérrez (Pennsylvania), Sean Rowe (Northwestern Pennsylvania and Western New York), and Robert Wright (Atlanta) have been selected for nomination as the church's next presiding bishop. Central New York Bishop DeDe Duncan-Probe on April 16 was added as a nominee by petition to stand for election as The Episcopal Church's 28th presiding bishop, joining four other bishops who were announced two weeks ago on the initial slate of nominees to succeed Presiding Bishop Michael Curry.
