Holy Baptism is the initiation by which we become members of Christ's body, the Church, and are invited to grow in love for God and service to others, supported by a spiritual family.

We Hear the Word of God

THE FIRST READING: Acts 8:26-40

Lector A reading from the book of Acts.

²⁶An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) ²⁷So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." ³⁰So Philip ran up to it and

heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. ³²Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this: "Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. ³³In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth." ³⁴The eunuch asked Philip, "About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" ³⁵Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" ³⁸He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. ³⁹When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

THE PSALM: Psalm 22:24-30 Deus, Deus meus

The Psalm is said responsively by whole verse at the 8 AM service, and sung at the 10:30 service.

- 24 My praise is of him in the great assembly; * I will perform my vows in the presence of those who worship him.
- 25 The poor shall eat and be satisfied, and those who seek the LORD shall praise him: * "May your heart live for ever!"
- 26 All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD, * and all the families of the nations shall bow before him.
- 27 For kingship belongs to the LORD; * he rules over the nations.
- 28 To him alone all who sleep in the earth bow down in worship; * all who go down to the dust fall before him.
- 29 My soul shall live for him; my descendants shall serve him; * they shall be known as the LORD's for ever.
- 30 They shall come and make known to a people yet unborn * the saving deeds that he has done.

THE SECOND READING: 1 John 4: 7-21

Lector A reading from the first letter of John.

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us. By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world. God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. So we have known and believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because he first loved us. Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

We have a new Rector!



The Rev. Joshua Rodrigez-Hobbs has been called to be the new Rector for Epiphany Episcopal Church. His first Sunday is August 4. Josh is currently serving as the Interim Rector at nearby St. Martins in the Field in Severna Park. The announcement regarding the new Rector for Epiphany was sent on Thursday, April 25 via our e-news list. The message from the Vestry includes a summary of the Search process as well as information about the rest of our Transition from now until August. A hard copy of the message was mailed to each household, and a video from the new Rector is on the webpage. Copies of

the letter from the Vestry and a letter from Josh+ are available in the Church and members of the Vestry will be on hand after both services.

A huge thank you goes to Joe Gill and the Search Committee for their work in screening and unanimously recommending Josh+ to the Vestry. His election was also unanimous.

Our Interim Rector, Anne+ will conclude her time with us on June 30, as it is customary to have a period of time between the departure of the Interim and the first Sunday of a new Rector.

In addition, the Rev. Mark Winward, who has been present and very supportive of the ministry of Epiphany in addition to his duties as the head Chaplain of NSA, will retire in July. Mark will complete his time at Epiphany by serving as supply July 14, 21 and 28. Plans are being made to honor both Anne+ and Mark+, as well as welcome Josh+. If you wish to assist in this festive and important transition time, please speak to any member of the Vestry.
