At the time of Communion, you may intinct ("dip") the consecrated bread in the small intinction bowl of wine offered by the Celebrant, or drink from the chalice of wine. Gluten—free wafers and non-alcoholic wine are offered by the Priest when you come forward to receive Holy Communion.






